

Cultural Emphasis

Language is taught in an environment that is embedded with Cree tradition of prayer, song and ceremony. Students also have access to Cree cultural activities both in the class room and in the wider school environment. These include pipe ceremonies; give away ceremonies, night lodges, chicken dances and ghost dances.

Elders

There are two resident Elders on staff and in addition to this the Cree language program regularly invites Elders to be part of the teaching team. The intent of the program is to assist students in developing relationships with Elders or language speakers who can enhance their language acquisition experience.

Community Engagement

The program actively encourages and finds opportunities for students to engage in community revitalizing projects such as talking with students groups, conference presentations, and immersion weekends.
